#### 1\_Announcement

The purpose of this notice is to advise that Ingenico US is announcing a withdrawal from marketing and sale of the 16MB+128MB PCI-PTS v3.x model of the iUP250 in the US.

The relevant dates and support commitments are detailed below.

Impacted product models include, but may not be limited to:

• IUP250-01P1992

Please note that all revisions within said part numbers are included in this notice. For example, IUP250-01P1992 includes IUP250-01P1992A, IUP250-01P1992B, etc.

#### 2\_Rationale

Payment devices (hardware) and POS applications (software) are evolving technologies. They follow a natural product life cycle. Payment hardware is primarily governed by the Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council's (PCI SSC) regulatory compliance requirements, EMVCo and Card brand requirements, in addition to market activity and market demand.

As payment applications evolve, and additional card brand solutions are supported, payment terminals require additional memory to facilitate future expansion. The iUP250 has been updated from 16MB+128MB to 32MB+128MB. This is NOT an EOL for the entire iUP250 line. This EOL only affects the lower memory device.
